

Panel discussions and professionals in STEM regarding diversity initiatives also occur throughout the day in addition to presentations of marginalized groups.

THE WISE GALA

→ Sponsorship Goal: \$10,000

Last year, to great success, WISE hosted its first annual gala; an event that recognized all the hard work and accomplishments of our members, sponsors, volunteers and executives with a fun year end event. The opportunity to celebrate diversity and network in a fun and safe environment received resounding praise and was enjoyed by all who attended. We hope to carry on this new tradition by hosting a gala again this year.

EARTH SCIENCE FOR SOCIETY

March 2025 - \$150

BUILDING BRIDGES MENTORSHIP PROGRAM

→ 2024/2025 - \$400

The "Building Bridges" mentorship program was established to foster collaboration among women in STEM by connecting female undergraduate STEM students with mentors working in the STEM field. The program features two key events, the Mentorship Kick-off and the Mentorship Wrap-Up Celebration, ensuring mentors and mentees can meet in person at least twice. Corporate sponsors are invited to send representatives to participate as mentors for the students. Last year, we had over 30 mentor/mentee pairings!

KIDS IN STEM

Budget of \$200

Wise presents this initiative to children aged 8-12 at the Calgary Public Library. These presentations involve hands-on experiments where children can explore different areas of science.



PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT WORKSHOPS (PDW)

Budget of \$1,000

Hosted on a monthly basis in partnership with a featured corporate sponsor, PDWs provide students with the opportunity to hear from industry leaders, engage in networking opportunities, hone their professional development skills and more. The WISE team loves to collaborate with sponsors to plan and design different sessions that promote diversity, equity and inclusion within STEM, tailored to your organization.



VOLUNTEERING PROGRAM

Budget of \$200

WISE's volunteering program provides students with the opportunity to engage in community service, develop leadership skills and build a supportive and meaningful network. With the efforts to inspire and uplift the next generation of women in STEM, as well as give back to the community our volunteers work to create a positive impact by participating in a variety of events throughout the year. Including events at the Calgary Public Library, the Calgary Food Bank, the Mustard Seed, the Foothills Hospital and many more.

LUNCH & LEARN

Budget of \$100

Hosted every two months, Lunch and Learn provides
High School students with tips and tricks in order to be
successful in University; this includes advice on the

and opportunity for students to inquire about a degree in
STEM and university life. The WISE team is looking to
expand this program into middle schools featuring
similar activities and information.



WISE SCHOLARSHIP

Budget of \$1,000

Every year, WISE offers a scholarship to two female University of Calgary students pursuing a major in science or engineering.

WISE RESEARCH AWARD

Budget of \$8,000

WISE provides funding to eight female and gender-diverse students in grade 11 to participate in a summer research studentship with a supervisor of their choice at the University of Calgary.
